“ I would like to offer my deepest sympathy to all of June's extended family. June and I were friends for over 35 years. I worked with her at Illini in Carlinville. I never had more fun at a job than at that one. She was a wonderful boss and an even better friend. After the office closed we remained friends the rest of her life. We became closer when she retired and my kids grew up. We both had more time to call each other. We had marathon phone conversations, really 2-3 hours was nothing unusual. I could complain, get advice, get another point of view (an older and wiser one) and always laugh. I never ended a call without feeling happier. We usually ended our calls because we had to go to the bathroom! Last winter I was in Texas for 2 months. I was bored and lonely a lot of the time. I could always call June and we had a lot of nice talks. She told me a lot about her years growing up, school, etc. June always was honest with you. She told you what she thought and how things were. There was no deception or putting on airs. When I worked for her she told me I would look so much better if I stood up straight and that I was wearing my dresses too long. She was right. I just had not really noticed. I had the dresses hemmed. And I finally started to pay attention to posture, something I had heard from my mother for years but ignored.

I could talk for hours about her. But just know that I share in your sorrow today and for years into the future.
