Elizabeth Tudor Bourland, 82, died Tuesday, August 21, 2018 at Mercy Hospital in St. Louis, MO. Born February 23, 1936 in Brownstown, IL. She devoted her life to her children, friends and the pursuit of learning for all people. Beth, as she was known by many was a loyal and giving person.
