



Dr. Abron Adrian Grandia

December 28, 1926 - June 25, 2017

Dateline: Edwardsville

Abron Adrian Grandia was born on December 28, 1926 and subsequently raised on a small farm in rural Iowa which typified the life of this gentle, compassionate man who lived a life filled with passion, tempered by humility and leadership by example.

He went through the public school system in Pella Iowa and the summer of his junior year of high school he was horseback riding and was kicked by another horse, fracturing his left femur. Due to the rehabilitation time of that injury in that era he missed his senior year of high school and was subsequently drafted into the army, serving in Japan in WW II. His military service saw the close of the war at which time he returned to the family farm with all intentions of engaging the honorable occupation of farming for his life's career.

Enter Bernice Vansteenien, who he fondly referred to as Bea, who, over the course of time, became his loving, able and willing partner for just shy of 64 years of marriage. Along with Bea's encouragement he decided to pursue medicine and eventually Orthopedic surgery. Following completion of his Orthopedic training at the University of Iowa, he relocated Bea and his three children Ronn, Lon and Shawn to Alton Illinois in 1961 where he began his Orthopedic practice. He became a gifted surgeon and an immeasurable asset to the profession. He truly loved what he did and was completely immersed in the profession. With skilled hands and use of plates, screws, wires and rods countless useless limbs were restored to full function

Although his profession was that of a surgeon, he retained, in equal measure, his love of farming. He purchased a small farm in Alton shortly after beginning his Orthopedic practice in Alton and soon set about building terraces, addressing washouts, improving the quality of the soil. He built ponds and instituted a wild life program. In the early 70's he acquired some additional ground and was introduced to Mr. Herb Moore and Mr. Charles Schoeneman, local farmers who, following a hand shake agreement, entered a farming partnership that evolved into life long friendships whose whole was truly greater than the sum of its parts. They continued to make improvements on these farms and in 1977 was awarded conservation farmer of the year in Madison county.

Busy as he was, he always managed to find time to spend with the family. Much of this was spent on the Mississippi river, skiing from sunup to sundown as well as spending time on his farm.

On June 25, 2017 we lost a rare individual who possessed such class and grace, the model by which he lived his life and touched all those around him. Thank you, you will be missed

“ I was also a lifelong friend of Lonn's and was blessed to have spent so much time with their family. I can honestly say that I would not be the person I am today had it not been for the guidance and love that their family had shown to me growing up. But I was not unique, there were countless other people that benefited from their generosity and many that will never be revealed. Many years ago I found out that Dr. and Mrs. Grandia had provided educational grants to people who could not have funded an education on their own. They never told anyone they were doing this, they just felt compelled to do this as a way to give back to people who needed it. I can only wonder how many people's lives were positively impacted by their acts of generosity and love.

When my wife and I got married in 1986 I think they knew that we were just starting out and didn't have much money so they donated the use of their Tan-Tar-A condo for our honeymoon. We were absolutely thrilled and were so appreciative of them doing this for us. What a great way to start a life together!

But, one of my other favorite stories that I've told many people over the years, is about my Mom's car. When we were growing up in D'Adrian Gardens, a block away from Grandia's house, Lonn would let me help understand and build motors for the countless cars that they were always working on. One day he wanted to show me how a Volkswagen engine was put together and was showing me some key components when a bolt or pin dropped down the carburetor. We tried for hours to get it out but it went into the intake and was impossible to get. When I told my Mom about this she was so mad because that was our only car. We had the car towed to a mechanic shop on Godfrey Rd around 5pm that night and had to hope that they could get to it the next day so my Mom could go to work. The next morning the car was in our driveway and we were shocked so I walked up to Grandia's house and Lonn told me that he and his Dad went to the shop in the middle of the night, tore the engine apart, removed the pin, put the engine back together, and drove it home to our house. I was absolutely speechless and couldn't believe that

there were people like this in the world.

There were many, many other stories like this but I remember this like it happened yesterday and I will always remember these acts of random kindness and love that the entire Grandia family showed me growing up. I wish that I had stayed in better contact with all of them later in life and I hope that someday I can repay them for everything they did for me.

Thank you Dr. Grandia for the love you gave to so many people over your lifetime. You made such a difference in people's lives and we all are better people because of you. I will never forget you and I will pass that love on to other people that I meet in my life so your love and generosity will go on forever.
