Alice E. McMahon, 89, died at 4:50 a.m. Wednesday, December 7, 2011 at Rosewood Care Center in Edwardsville. She retired as a secretary for Marquette Catholic High School in Alton after over 15 years of service and was a member of Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church.
