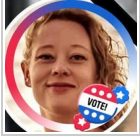

“ I first met Sutton at the agency where I worked. He came in, was hired and assigned a desk caddy corner from mine. I’m an introvert – a solitary soul, very hard to get to know. Sutton broke through that aloofness in a matter of days. He was a people person – he could talk with anyone. Sutton was a great, intuitive listener who I often relied on for advice. He was wise and smart, and I never met a single person who disliked him. He was the best dream interpreter I ever knew. We had a ton of stuff in common: classic horror films (Svengoolie), fringe spirituality, magical thinking...we even liked (and hated) the same foods. We shared an irreverent sense of humor. Sutton was the only male in our midst, and we teased him mercilessly. We’d put “Hello, Kitty” stickers all over the men’s restroom (he hated “Hello Kitty”) and post Barry Manilow’s face on his computer screen when he carelessly left it open. We would all laugh, but there was one thing you could always count on with Sutton: Retaliation. You never knew where or when, but you knew it was coming. He was King of the Earworm. I remember once he sent a friend an email with the subject line, “Your Wife”. Inside were the lyrics to the “Hokey Pokey” - now get THAT one out of your head! I remember once, he asked me if I was ever going to call him “Chris”. I smiled and said nothing. To me he was always Sutton. I often felt that Sutton and I had been siblings or shared the same tribe in a former life. When he started making TV appearances and doing larger paranormal investigations, I knew he belonged to the world. We had to let him go to walk his path. Rarely has a man given so much to so many. He touched and enriched everyone he encountered in this life. I am so glad he left this plane at home, surrounded by the family he loved. Sutton knew where he was headed. I know he felt no fear, but I also know it must have been hard to leave his family. Julia, Max and Emily were always the most important things in his life. Although we can’t see him, I know he’s still there, walking a higher plane. In a day or ten years, I’ll meet him there. We’ll share a big hug and lots of laughter – always laughter! Farewell for now, my brother. Miss you. See you soon. Peace, Mel.
