“Surely Hope touched a multitude of lives over the years, making the world a better place one student at a time. Although I graduated from MELHS in 2006, I still think about her when I write. I still, to this day, joke about puppies being messy, noisy, and expensive.

My wife and I homeschool our 4 children, and although they're a little young for 5 paragraph essays, they're already aware of this timeless truth, and when the time comes, you bet they'll remember to show me and not just tell me about puppies being messy, noisy, and expensive.

As memorable as Hope's personality and teaching was, I also remember her chapels. She used an old liturgy of confession where she would confess to us, and then we—the congregation—would confess back to her. It went something like this “I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my own fault, through my most grievous fault.” There is something humbling about having someone in authority confess their sinfulness to you.

This chapel doesn't end there, of course. It's followed by the proclamation of the gospel—that the blood of Christ, our Paschal lamb, was shed to blot out our sins and purify us of our uncleanness. Moreover, Hope has been united in the Lamb's resurrection. Know this: our God is not a God of the dead, but of the living. Hope's body may have passed away, but make no mistake—she lives. She lives with her savior Jesus Christ, and on the last day she will rise with a multitude of students to a world where puppies are no longer messy, noisy, or expensive.

So, here's my clincher and call to action: if you're one of her former students, family, or friends, and you don't know Christ the way Hope did, I've got good news, and it's the same Good News which Hope is resting in this very moment, that God has redeemed us, and his blood is powerful to cover all our failures and repair all our

brokenness. As I'm sure she knew and has full realization of this very moment, his yoke is easy and his burden is light. God blesses his people with blessings that make the things of this world look like horse manure. Turn to Christ and live. Live with Hope.
