Joseph Millitello, 81, died at 1:25 p.m. Saturday, May 25, 2019 at his home in Alton. Born June 25, 1937 in Alton, he was the son of Luke and Lucille (Romano) Millitello. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean conflict. He was a member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church until they closed and then was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church. He retired in November of 1997 as a lab technician for McDonnell-Douglas in St. Louis, MO. On January 10, 1959 he married the former Bernice Malone at SS Peter & Paul Catholic Church in Alton. She survives.
