“ I found out about Kyle's passing late Saturday while I was spending my birthday with my daughter's family at the Iowa State Fair. When I got the call and my brother told me we'd lost Kyle it didn't really register right away. Kyle is my 1st cousin and we were born the same year. Growing up in Alton in our very early years the Steiner family lived just down the road from the Boswells. Our mothers were sisters and very close; at least that is my memory of them. Kyle and his older brother Kim were heroes to me growing up. I wish I'd told Kyle that. Kyle's family moved to Godfrey when we were still very young and we spent our childhood in different parts of the greater Alton school system until we met again in High School. Kyle was such a great athlete and liked by so many. This is very hard to wright; this hits so close to home. When we were graduating HS more than one friend ask me if I was sure about what I was doing. West Point or any military academy were not popular choices in those years. For the most part I didn't take the questions seriously until Kyle questioned me. It gave me pause because I could tell he was genuinely concerned; not that I'd be able to make it through the academy but that I'd end up in Vietnam. We spent our adult lives far apart but Kyle always enjoyed a visit from family and we'd share memories of our mothers who both died far too young and of our stubborn, prideful fathers. Kim I can't imagine what you are feeling right now. We've both lost younger siblings but to be the oldest and the last..... My heart goes out to Kyle's wonderful children & grandchildren, to Martha and to Kim and his family. I wish I could be there with you.
