Leah Elaine Abromovich, born on November 9, 1934, in Coulterville, Illinois, peacefully departed from this world on Sunday, March 24, 2024. Leah was preceded in death by her parents and her brothers, Kenneth, Floyd, Wilbur, Dean and Earl, as well as her husband, Philip, in 1988. Though

separated by time, they are reunited once more in eternal peace.
