Leona Bertha Piggott, 99, died at 11:34 p.m. Thursday, October 16, 2025 at her home in Alton. She was born at home in Alton on January 25, 1926, daughter of Leo Samuel and Helen Dorothy (Moore) Scheibe. She married her high school sweetheart, Robert Allen Piggott on August 25, 1945 in St. Charles, MO. Bob and Leona were a hardworking industrial couple. They purchased a small farm and began raising cattle as a second job in 1962. In 1965 Leona began employment at McDonnell Douglas, now Boeing, and retired in 1987.
