He was retired from Local 338 in Wood River. Mo was a U.S. Army veteran, was a well-known fastpitch softball pitcher and was inducted into the Illinois ASA Hall of Fame in 1993 and the Metro St. Louis USA Softball Hall of Fame in 2010. He was an avid golfer, loved boating and was a member of the Alton Owls Club. On November 14, 1964 in Alton he married Kathy (Marth) and she survives. 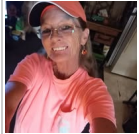
