September 22, 1931 - March 6, 2024

Ray Monte Graves, 92, formerly of Godfrey, peacefully went to be with our Lord at 5:00 a.m. on Wednesday, March 6, 2024, surrounded by his children and grandchildren at his home in Poulsbo, WA. He was born September 22, 1931 in St. Louis, MO, the oldest of four sons of the late Ansel and Artie (Clark) Graves. He graduated from Alton High School in January 1950 and enlisted in the U.S. Air Force. He served during the Korean War and was honorably discharged in 1954. He was a former member of Elm Street Presbyterian Church and Evangelical United Church of Christ in Godfrey. Ray was a member of the Belt Line Men's Association and belonged to the Franklin Masonic Lodge #25, the VFW Post 1308, and the Wood River Kiwanis Club. In 1995 he retired as president and owner of Superior Interior Furniture and Flooring in Alton after 50 years of service. On June 8, 1951 he married Norma Jean Skipper and she preceded him in death on February 12, 1997. He then married Wanda Yvonne Miller on March 14, 1998 and she preceded him in death on July 5, 2019.
