Richard Allen Gleason, 89, died at 2:45 p.m. on Sunday, May 3, 2026 at Alton Memorial Rehab. He was born January 7, 1937 in Alton, the son of the late Basil and Fannie Mae (Garner) Gleason. He was raised by his grandmother, "Mom" Lucille. Richard graduated from Alton High School in 1955 where he participated in the State track championship. He retired in 1990 after 40 years as a salesman for Sears, Roebuck and Co. in Alton.
