



Robert Bradford Middleton Eichen

October 6, 1958 - April 5, 2024

Robert Bradford Middleton Eichen, 65, died at 3:39 p.m. Friday, April 5, 2024 at his home in Godfrey with his “Shell Shell” by his side. Born October 6, 1958 in Alton, he was the son of Harriett “Harry Lou” Eichen and the late Howard Eichen. Many knew him as a meat cutter for Schwegel’s Market. He attended Carthage College in Kenosha, WI, with a major in criminal justice and worked for the Alton Police Department. He later worked as an engineer for the Alton Fire Department, retiring in January of 2019, after 30 years of service.

Following his retirement, he worked security for OSF St. Anthony’s Healthcare Center in Alton. Bob continued to enjoy working out daily even during his illness. He was an avid collector of dinosaur figures and all things Marvel and DC. He also loved walking his dogs with his invention of the “Eichen walk the dog system.” On October 10, 2020 he married Shelley (Watson) Bauser in St. Petersburg Beach, FL. She survives. Along with his mother and wife, he is survived by his sons, Davey Eichen (Daisy) and Alex Eichen, daughters, Leslie Conlee (Reggie), Lindsey Cress (Randy), and Lauren Gage (Thomas), grandchildren, Lela and Sidney Eichen, Corbin, Boden and Zoe Leezy, Mackenzie and Dylan Pitts, Wyatt and Will Conlee, Kylie Angel, Harper Gage, Austin Cress (Aja), and Ryan Cress, and great grandchildren, Mylo and Haddie. Bob lived in the ymca weightlifting all summer long when about 12 and up, I was doing Judo and got Bob to take judo class because he was a big fan of “dick the bruiser” the wrestler. Anyway Bob got a trophy in his first Judo tournament as a yellow tip belt doing moves like the bruiser. We both were on the wrestling team and Bob was a hard person to beat with all that time picking up and putting down many heavy things, a very strong person indeed. I remember a party at the old Western military Academy with Bob wearing a white sheet like a classical Greek figure with a red solo cup in one hand and a heavy stone bust of some noted person in the other he picked up in the Library. After h/s I heard Bob gave the Marines a try and I gave the Navy 6 years on a ship in New England, I never looked back on Alton. I never spoke to Bob again until 2008 when we both buried our boys just 3 months apart. That changes you more than words can describe. That was the time I read Bobs poetry as he tried to workout what life was handing him. I told Bob this a place you decide to be even stronger, don’t let it bring you down. I went to mass daily for a year to keep breathing and be stronger. Bob was always near people that looked up to him because he was strong.

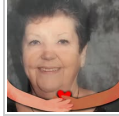
