Robert "Bob" Donald Schmidt, 81, died Tuesday, January 10, 2017 at John Cochran VA Hospital in St. Louis, MO. Born August 18, 1935 in Alton, he was the son of V.A. and Martha Helen (Lamar) Schmidt. Mr. Schmidt served in the U.S. Army. He retired in 1997 from the ammunition shipping department of the Olin Corporation after over 40 years of service. He was a member of the St. Louis Mariners Club and loved model building especially airplanes, ships or trains. On October 2, 1964, he married the former Glenda Sue Hardesty in Alton. She survives.
