I think it had been close to two months since the girls had seen or spoken to their father. The older daughter immediately began crying and Torin kept trying to sooth her and tell her everything would be alright. The youngest was acting cheerful and excited to see her dad and maybe trying to help her sister cope. It was very emotional. I stepped out of the truck to let them have privacy or maybe to keep myself from crying. Torin loved his kids more than anything and, obviously, those kids felt the same.

The last time I saw Torin was August 17th. We laughed and joked for hours and when he left, he said, "it's great to see you." I responded, "same here man, great to see you." He said he had to get home to his puppy. I had just got his new number and called him back on August 23rd. He didn't answer and never returned the call.
