William Gerald Rister, 96, died at 7:10 p.m. Sunday, January 28, 2024 at La Bella of Alton with his family by his side. Born January 25, 1928 in Elsah, IL, he was the son of William H. and Violet (Stucker) Rister. He served with the U.S. Air Force in Guam during WWII. In 1989 he retired as a lineman from Union Electric and was a member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers for 75 years. On November 17, 1956 he married the former Dorothy Nevlin at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Beltrees. She preceded him in death on July 7, 2016. Above all, his family was his pride and joy. He was a very humble man and an avid outdoorsman. He enjoyed gardening, fishing and hunting and was a member of the Alton VFW Post 1308. Surviving are two daughters, Bonnie Hindelang (Dan Hornsey) of Grafton, and Diana Crowder (Kevin) of Brighton, two sons, Joe Rister (Jennifer) of Brighton, and Duane Rister (Candy) of Fosterburg.
